The Collation of Archdeacons and Installation of Cathedral Canons

The Congregation is seated. The Dean presents the archdeacons- and canons-designate, who stand before the Bishop.

Meet Our New Archdeacons and Cathedral Canons



Canon Brenda Nestegaard Paul was born and raised in Regina, SK. She is currently the rector of Trinity Anglican-Lutheran Parish in Port Alberni, and is the first Lutheran to be appointed a Cathedral Canon in this diocese. Prior to ordination, she was a singer/actor/voice teacher/director/CBC freelance journalist, often all at the same time, who intermittently worked in high end fashion retail. Her favourite gospel is John, followed very closely by Luke. She is currently reading *Braiding Sweetgrass* by Robin Wall Kimmer.



Archdeacon Elizabeth Northcott is originally from Winnipeg, but was raised in the Maritimes. She came to us after serving the Diocese of New Westminster. Currently, she is the Rector of the Church of St Mark in Qualicum Beach; has served as the Regional Dean of Nimpkish; and for the last couple of years was one of our six Cathedral Canons. Prior to entering seminary in Montreal, Elizabeth was the Executive Director of the Nova Scotia Forestry Association. Her favorite gospel is John and she is currently reading Louise Penny's *The Madness of Crowds*.



Canon Eric Partridge was born in upstate New York and, after living in Delaware, Maryland, and Wisconsin, moved to BC in 1969. He had an eclectic professional history prior to ordination as—amongst other things—an elementary school teacher, a corporate/commercial lawyer, and a provincial Assistant Deputy Ministry of the Environment. His favourite gospel passage at the moment is the Beatitudes (Matthew 5.1-12); and he is currently reading *God's Behaving Badly*, by Marie Phillips.



Archdeacon Lon Towstego was born in Saskatoon, and moved to the coast in 1986. He is currently the Rector of the Parish of Central Saanich, consisting of St. Mary's Saanichton and St Stephen's South Saanich. Prior to ordination Lon made a business of his motorcycle hobby. His favourite gospel reading is John 13.1-17 (Jesus washing the feet of the twelve), and lately he has been reading mystery novels by David Baldacci and Clive Cussler.
