Ian Alexander

Christ Church Cathedral (Greater Victoria) Nominated for Lay General Synod



I am a "cradle Anglican," and a lay canon of the Diocese of Islands and Inlets. My family roots are on the West Coast, though I spent most of my academic and professional life in Toronto (including a 25-year career with the CBC). Since moving to Victoria in 2007, I have worshipped at Christ Church Cathedral and maintained an independent consulting practice.

I have served on the Cathedral's Council and Management Team, on Diocesan Council and Finance Committee, and on the Council of General Synod for the national church. I continue to be active as volunteer and consultant to various church bodies, including recently the Dioceses of Toronto, Huron and New Westminster.

I am currently the Prolocutor of General Synod, serving as associate and assistant to the Primate, and an *ex officio* member of all national church committees. In that capacity I will, God willing, preside at the primatial election during the meeting of General Synod in London, ON next June. It would be a privilege to also represent this diocese as a voting member of that Synod, during a time when important decisions will be taken affecting the future of our church.

I helped in setting up the secondhand bookstore and over saw it for10 years, and involved in many Parish activities youth programs, VBS etc.
